In instances where there is no benefit to be gained from the personal attendance of a Halton Regional Police Officer, you may be directed to attend the Police Reporting Centre for the following additional occurrences:

Theft from a motor vehicle

Theft of bicycles and/or personal property

Damage to a motor vehicle and/or personal property

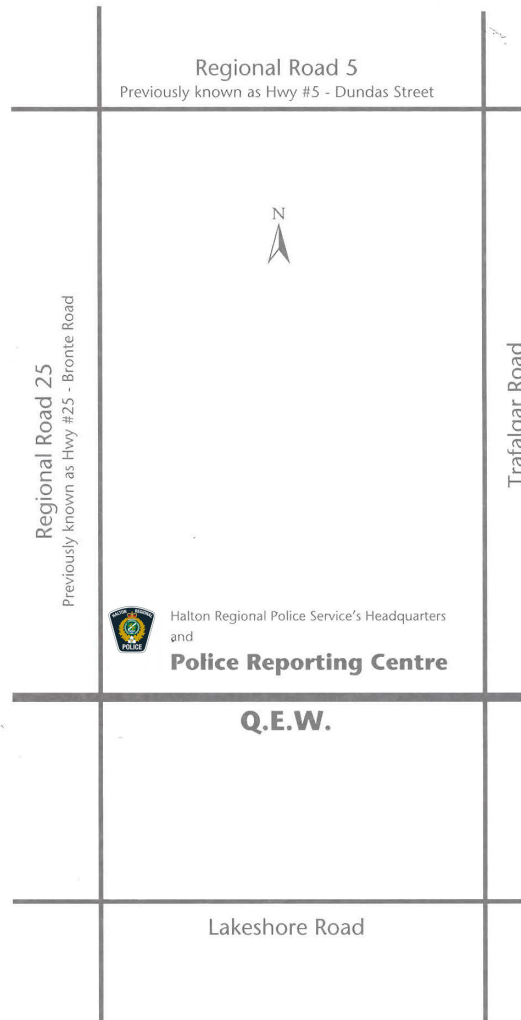
Lost property

NEW: ONLINE Reporting

Members of the public can now report incidents falling under the above-noted categories online via the HRPS website: www.haltonpolice.ca. Click on *File A Report -- ONLINE Reporting* for more information.

Note: The Ontario Highway Traffic Act (HTA) requires that all motor vehicle collisions where persons are injured, where total damage exceeds \$1,000.00 in value and/or where there is damage to highway property **MUST** be reported immediately to the police.

When Should A Driver Attend the PRC?

A driver involved in a **non-injury collision on private property (i.e. parking lot)** should report to the PRC during business hours.

PRC will **NOT** investigate collisions involving:

- Injury and/or death
- Criminal activity such as impaired driving, stolen vehicles and assault
- Federal, provincial or municipal vehicles
- Vehicles transporting dangerous goods
- Damage to private, municipal and/or highway property
- Accidents involving a person who is uninsured and/or is a suspended driver

What is a Police Reporting Centre (PRC)?

A **Police Reporting Centre (PRC)** is a facility where the public in Burlington and Oakville report traffic collisions and other types of occurrences.

Motor Vehicle Collisions:

The following steps should be taken **before** attending the Police Reporting Centre:

1. Check the "Exceptions List" in this pamphlet to determine if police presence is required. If in doubt, call the police.
2. If it is safe to do so, remove the vehicle from the roadway.
3. Exchange information with the other involved parties, including independent witnesses. Obtain names, addresses, phone numbers, insurance and vehicle particulars.
4. Contact the Halton Regional Police Service at 905-825-4777. An officer may be dispatched to the accident scene, or you may be directed to attend the PRC.

What to Bring to the Police Reporting Centre:

When reporting a motor vehicle collision to the PRC, bring the following documentation with you:

- Driver's licence
- Vehicle ownership
- Proof of insurance
- Any other pertinent information

***** ACCIDENTS REQUIRING VEHICLE TOWING MUST HAVE A POLICE OFFICER ATTEND THE SCENE. VEHICLES ARE NOT TO BE TOWED TO THE PRC*****

Did you know?

The HRPS Police Reporting Centre processes more than 4,000 motor vehicle accident reports each year.



Should Hit and Run Collisions Be Reported at the PRC?

Yes, if there is **no** evidence, suspect information or evidence at the scene. An HRPS officer will be dispatched, however, if the suspect vehicle is still in the area of the collision.
