## How are personal mobility devices HTA classified?

Wheelchair. It is not a motor vehicle under the HTA.

## Who can use this device?

It is designed and intended to be used by people with mobility disabilities. There is no minimum operator age.

No helmet is required nor is a driver's licence, insurance or registration.

## Where on the roadway can the device be operated? Where can it not be used?

The devices can be used on sidewalks, if municipalities allow. Otherwise, users must travel along the left shoulder of the roadway facing oncoming traffic, like pedestrians.

Use of the devices on controlled access highways (e.g. 400-series highways, provincial highways 69, 6, 24, 35, 58 and specific parts of certain provincial highways) is prohibited. Municipalities may also ban use.
